I met Lynn in June 1990 when I attended her wedding to our brother Daniel in Denver. Right from the airport I experienced Lynn's genuine love towards me.

My stay with them was one of the most enjoyable times in my life; I was made to feel so much at home and loved. After the wedding, Lynn and Daniel took me and our late Aunt Mrs Claudia Ahwireng, who had also travelled from Maryland for the wedding, on trips around Denver and the beautiful Colorado Mountains. By the time I left, Lynn and I were calling each other sisters. My sister Dinah and I gained a true sister. Dinah also recounts Lynn's boundless love towards her during her numerous visits to Denver.

Returning home was a whole story; to cut it short, I travelled to the US with one suitcase and returned with three full of precious gifts carefully chosen by Lynn for her London family that she had not yet met. I will never forget during one of my visits to Denver, my daughter Hilary was going to start university (college) and Lynn decided to buy her a travel case. I lost count of the number of shops we visited; Lynn always carried her tape measure and sketch as she was determined to find a steady and versatile case for Hilary. Hilary loved the case and still uses it to this day.

I remember Lynn's first visit to the UK; she hired a car and drove us to so many interesting sites including Windsor Castle, Stonehenge among a few. These were places that I had never been even though

I had lived in the UK for several years. Lynn initially struggled to navigate driving across roundabouts, but by the time we returned home, she had mastered it.

Every visit that we made to Denver was so much such fun; long drives, shopping trips, feasts at home prepared by Lynn. Likewise Lynn visited the UK a few times and it was so exciting having her in our home. She was so giving and gave good advice and services as required.

We were heartbroken when Lynn told us on her and Daniel's visit to the UK in April 2017 that she had been diagnosed with Alzheimer's type Dementia. She was very much aware of what to expect and I was also aware of the progression of the disease.

In July 2019 when Dinah and I attended Lynn and Daniel's 70th birthday party in Denver, the dementia had progressed however, Lynn was very happy and hospitable. Her love was boundless and genuine.

Lynn, you loved your London sisters and we love you too; nothing will separate that love we share.

We want to thank you for your boundless love towards our brother Daniel, and your selfless love towards the children, Kofi Armah, Aba, Ato and James.

We also wish to take the opportunity to thank Daniel for the excellent care he provided to Lynn right up till the end of her life.

We have indeed lost a great pillar in our family but we are holding on to all the wonderful memories we have of you.

We miss you but heaven has gained an angel.

May your beautiful soul rest peacefully with your maker.
