John toured me across the D&RGW main tracks from south end of Denver to the north, from the east end to the west, from Prospect thru Union Station, past Burhnam through South Denver interlocking, past Littleton further south toward Colo Springs.

John showed me the Stockyards, Commerce City, all the industry tracks off the Denver Belt Line, helped me navigate North Yard and pretty much everywhere the Rio Grande reached in Denver. John was the Roadmaster on the 1983 main track “Corridor” realignment out of Union Station to the location they exist today where all the UP & BN north/south railroad traffic exists today. He was a wonderful mentor, a giving, patient, instructive and at many times a quite hilarious friend and boss.
