



Michael Wayne Parks

September 10, 1949 - May 24, 2021

Michael Wayne Parks was born on September 10, 1949, to Aaron Jr. and Mildred Parks in Long Beach, California. He was the youngest of three children. He was preceded in death by both parents.

Michael grew up in Compton, California where he attended Pioneer Elementary School, Enterprise Junior High School and graduated from Compton Senior High in 1967. He attended Chadron State College where he excelled and earned notoriety as a defensive tackle. His former coach called Michael “the best defensive lineman I ever coached”. He was NAIA All American his senior year. Both Michael and his brother, Ken, were inducted together into the Chadron State Athletes Hall of Fame in 1993. In 2014, Michael was honored as one of 50 Star Athletes on Chadron State’s All-Century Team. Michael graduated from Chadron State in 1974 with a Bachelor of Arts degree. He continued the life-long friendships with fellow athletes until his death.

While attending Chadron State, Michael began working for the Pine Ridge Job Corps Center. Upon graduation he continued and expanded his employment with the USDA Forest Service. He worked in South Dakota, Wyoming, Colorado and Washington, D.C. At his retirement in 2006, Michael was a Human Resources Officer with oversight of 19 Forest Service Centers.

As a retiree, Michael kept an active lifestyle. He spent time with his grandchildren, worked on home improvements and was always in the gym (which was a good thing, because he loved pizza!) When he moved to an active senior’s community, he was vocal in advocating for better facilities and community services. Michael enjoyed venues for live music and traveling with his partner Karen. He especially loved to attend family gatherings. He was known for his mischievous humor, his generosity and perseverance. One thing he always said was “That if a thing is worth doing, do it right.”

Michael’s connection to Compton was never broken. He was one of the staunchest supporters for the Class of 1967 by attending reunions and in his many friendships,

Michael Milas and Cloyed Miller to name a few.

Michael is survived by his sister Norma Suber (Eddie), brother Kenneth Sr. (Melanie); daughters Kim Diggs (Darrell) and Melissa; grandchildren Vivienne, Alexander, and Diana Diggs; nephews Darryl Suber, Kenneth Jr., Michael Aaron and Justin Matthew Parks, nieces Deborah Suber Salcido, Chudnee Suzonne and Summer Danielle Parks; great-nephews and great-nieces, cousins, and a multitude of friends.

A memorial service is being planned for a later date at Inglewood Cemetery Park in Inglewood, California which will be his final resting place with the rest of the family.
