



Sidney Arnold

December 16, 1938 - October 31, 2014

Sidney Arnold was born to Matthew and Bessie Arnold in Lyons GA. He was the youngest of three children. Sidney was raised in Jacksonville FL. where he attended New Stanton High School. He served on the audio-visual staff, and was the assistant editor of the yearbook staff. He was an honor student and the president of his senior class.

After high school, Sidney began a distinguished military career. He proudly served four years in the United States Marine Corps. He then joined the United States Army. He bravely completed one combat tour in the Korean War, and two combat tours in the Vietnam War. He served more than twenty-four years, having seen many parts of the world. He earned the National Defense Service Medal; the Vietnam Service Medal (with three Bronze Service Stars); and the Bronze Star Medal. He also earned the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry; the Good Conduct Medal; the Army Commendation Medal; the Vietnam Campaign Medal; the Sharpshooter Badge (with Rifle Bar); and the Meritorious Service Medal.

Perhaps what Sidney was most proud of was earning the rank of Master Sergeant and helping many Black soldiers with his superior knowledge of personnel and administrative regulations and procedures. At his last duty station he was an Administrative Specialist managing more than three hundred military and civilian personnel. He had a second career working for the United States Postal Service. He earned many accolades, retiring after 20 years. Sidney valued education, and over time completed the course work for

his bachelor's degree in Math.

Sidney Arnold accepted Christ while attending New Hope Baptist Church under the pastoral leadership of Rev. M.C. Williams. He was always excited to share that he was baptized in the Red Sea while stationed overseas. He matured in his Christian walk and rededicated his life to Christ as a member of True Light Baptist Church, under the guidance of Rev. William T. Golson. Sidney was a fabulous dancer, loved bar-b-ques, and was an avid fan of the Denver Broncos and the Jacksonville Jaguars. He adored holiday celebrations, and always made sure his daughters received Valentine's Day candy. He took pride in his children and grandchildren - and that sentiment was fully reciprocated.

Sidney was preceded in death by his parents, Matthew and Bessie Arnold. He is survived by his Wife, Billie Jean Arnold; children, Robin Arnold of Huntsville, AL.; Phyllis Randall (Thaddeus) of Lansdowne VA; Mark Arnold (Grace) of Huntsville, AL; Jearrod Arnold (Nikki) of Covington GA; Sidra Score (Donald) of Mount Vernon, New York; and Miriam Arnold-Johnson, (Terron) of Snellville, GA. He is also survived by his sister, Freda Arnold of Jacksonville, FL; his brother Robert Arnold, Sr. (Jeanette) of Niceville, FL; and dear friends Louis and Carol Ware of Denver, CO.

He will continue to be honored as Grandpa Arnold by his fifteen grandchildren and three great grandchildren. "Arnold", "Sarge" and "Deac" will be missed by all of his family and friends.
